21st Century Classroom Video Contest Goes to Mark Melnyk of Markville
Secondary School, York Region District School Board**

Mississauga, Ontario: Thursday, February 5, 2009: The final HP MindShare Learning 21st Century Interactive Classroom contest winner, Mr. Mark Melnyk, is not your typical high school history teacher. Mr. Melnyk created the Classroom of the Future model which he conceived as the ultimate history learning and teaching resource for instructors and students alike, featuring a wide variety of technology and web-based learning tools, student exemplars, lesson plans, online projects, interactive activities, blogs, monitored online chat, and e-zines.

Through a video submission, K-12 educators from publicly funded schools across Canada were challenged to share their interactive classroom technology success stories or vision of the 21st century classroom. The goals of the contest, which was launched this past September, were to create a greater awareness around 21st century learning skills and the need to prepare students for the global, knowledge-based economy and to promote the sharing of best practices in the use of technology in the classroom.

Mr. Melnyk is a student's dream teacher, whose leadership captured the attention of the judges' panel for his ability to engage his students collaboratively to create a winning video submission that reflected the way they learn on a daily basis with the infusion of technology. As the winner of the HP MindShare Learning contest 3rd and final prize pack giveaway of over \$10,000 in classroom technology, Mr. Melnyk exemplifies excellence in classroom teaching with technology.

This inspiring 'stop- animation' video includes over 2,200 photos that capture the creative synergy between teachers and students, engendering the use of technology as a tool to reach 21st century learners and promote a passion for history and a love of learning.
